# "Missionary Musings"

The busy-ness of the Holiday Season has been amplified this year by the continuing clean-up and recovery effort in our area following Hurricane Michael. As I write this column (on the week after Thanksgiving) we have a team of 8 from the First Baptist church in Sandersville. GA. who are staying at Mt. Hebron Baptist Church and doing chain-saw jobs in our area. We are so grateful for these volunteers and all the aid we have been receiving from our sister Georgia Baptist Churches and Associations.

The last of the Southern Baptist Disaster Relief teams from Kentucky and South Carolina left our association on November 18th. These wonderful men and women served our community over a four week period following the storm. They completed 242 chainsaw jobs, put tarps on 52 homes, repaired 5 others, and logged 389 heavy-equipment hours over that 4-week period. They made 536 ministry contacts with the citizens of our area, and gave out 537 Bibles. Thev presented the Gospel 45 times reported 28 spiritual decisions! And all of that while preparing over 13,000 meals!

PRAISE THE LORD for the help He has supplied us here in southwest Georgia!

On another note, we held a called **Executive Committee meeting** on November 5th to take care of our annual business matters. At that meeting, the Bethel Assoc. formally adopted our 2018-2019 Fiscal Year Budget, and we also unanimously approved a Resolution o n Church Revitalization and Reaching the **Next Generation**. I believe that this is an important resolution that all of our churches should support and adopt for their own local ministry challenge. Because it is

so important, we are printing the Resolution as adopted here for all of you to read:



WHEREAS, the Bethel Baptist Association has faithfully ministered to the people of Southwest Georgia for 185 years.

WHEREAS, many of the churches of the Bethel Baptist Association have enjoyed the favor of God by experiencing seasons of great harvest and success in years past.

WHEREAS, today, many of the churches of the Bethel Baptist Association are plateaued or declining.

WHEREAS, this stagnation and decline is largely the result of ineffectiveness in reaching and discipling the next generation, in particular those under the age of 40.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Administrative Team, the Associational Missionary, and the messengers seated at the Nov. 5, 2018 called Executive Committee meeting of the Bethel Baptist Association desire to faithfully carry out the Great Commission (Matthew 28:18-20) within our community and believe in the empowerment of the Holy Spirit to enable us to accomplish this mission (Acts 1:8).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that we as an association of churches will prioritize (1) church revitalization (Revelation 3:2) and (2) reaching and discipling the next generation (Deuteronomy 6:4-7, Psalm 145:4, 2 T i m o t h y 1 : 5).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that we count the cost of reaching and discipling the next generation and follow a biblical course of action to take the gospel of Jesus Christ and biblical teaching to our areas of Christian service, equipping our membership to be obedient to Jesus Christ.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that we strongly encourage the individual churches of the Bethel Baptist Association to adopt this resolution and then evaluate their current ministries (music, Sunday school, midweek meetings, etc.) with respect to these priorities of (1) church revitalization and (2) reaching and discipling the next generation.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that we provide training to churches in evangelism, discipleship, and revitalization to assist leaders in equipping believers to carry out the Great Commission with an emphasis on these priorities.



On November 12th, I delivered 254 Christmas Backpacks to the Georgia Baptist Convention meeting in Warner Robbins, from our churches to the children of Appalachia. Shiloh Baptist Church is taking 220 backpacks directly to a ministry site in Appalachia this week, making a total of 474 backpacks given by Bethel Association churches this year to the children of Appalachia!

Which brings us to December and our own Christmas Backpacks distributions here in SW Georgia. Please note the complete schedule of the distribution events scheduled for our 6-county area elsewhere in this newsletter. And pray for all these events, and for the families that will be blessed by these ministries.
