"Missionary Musings"

By the time you read this newsletter, we will be wrapping-up our **Children's Summer Camps** at Kolomoki Mounds State Park for another year. I will give you a complete report on our 2018 %Arise+ Camps in the August edition of *The Bethel News*.

But this month I want to return to our discussion of **church revitalization** and Mark Cliftons probing question we proposed at the end of last months column: What about a dying church brings glory to God?+ (from *Reclaiming Glory* by John Mark Clifton, Broadman & Holman Publishing, Nashville, TN, 2016, pg.11).

I hope you egiven some prayerful thought and consideration to this. The answer that keeps leaping out at me is, sadly, *Nothing!+ There is nothing about a dying church that brings glory to God. Such a church is a poor witness to its community and to a critical, skeptical world.

So, what is the solution for a dying church? If you feel that you are a part of such a church, you and other members have been wondering, %How can we get out of the mess wege in?+ Well, the Good News is that %with God all things are possible+ (Matt. 19:26). But we have to make a choice to stop doing things the way we have been and to earnestly seek His guidance and His transforming, life-giving power for His church.

In Chapter 3 of Reclaiming Glory, John Mark Clifton proposes four %pathways+ toward %eplanting+ a church (pp. 35-51). With acknowledgement to him for igniting my thinking on the subject, I would like to modify his list to propose

six different choices that a dying congregation might make:

1. The first option is to do **nothing** at all, but to continue % as we have been +. This is not a pathway to church revitalization but, sadly, it is the choice of most dying churches, as evidenced by grim statistics I quoted last month. The **end** result of this choice is that the church eventually disbands and leaves behind an empty, abandoned building.

The next five options are possible paths to revitalization:

- 2. The church can experience internal revitalization through true revival not a series of special meetings, but a period of repentance and returning to Gods biblical principles for life as His people. It is characterized by intense prayer and reconciliation between church members, and results in a renewed outward focus on evangelism and missions. It is 100% a work of the Holy Spirit, but the church members must yield control to Him!
- 3. As the church members pray and seek Gods direction, the Holy Spirit sometimes leads them to share their church facilities with a new church plant or church plants. In doing so, they are exercising good stewardship of their material resources while catching the excitement of participating in something new!
- 4. Or, the Holy Spirit may lead them to merge with another congregation, old or new. This is particularly difficult to pull-off in Baptist circles due to our polity, but if both congregations are overwhelmingly supportive of the concept, they can work out the

kinks, with Godos help.

- 5. Or, the Holy Spirit could lead them to actually **re-plant the church** to reach a different group of people. This may or may not entail a change of location. It may or many not entail a name change. But it will always require that the church leadership **relinquish control** to a new set of leaders, often through the involvement of a ministry partner such as a Mission Board or the local Association.
- 6. A final option is that the congregation may vote to disband but to leave a Kingdom legacy by donating the church property to a new church plant or to a ministry partner, such as the local association, who will utilize that property to help start a new work or new works.

Did you notice that the last five options all have one thing in common? They all involve a willingness to **change** and to relinquish or give-up **control** of something to someone (or someone else). The first option (the one most dying churches take) is all about % anging on to what we eye got.+ Interestingõ
