Itos hard to believe that schools are already back in session and another Summer is drawing to a close. You will see in this * Newsletter that we are

already preparing for our Annual Fall Meeting and Children's Home Truck Loading on October 15th at Fort Gaines Baptist Church. I hope that your church has elected messengers to this important meeting, and that your folks have already started collecting the items requested by the Children's Home this year (see list elsewhere in this Newsletter). Also, we will be voting on a proposed amendment to our BBA By-Laws at this meeting, the text of which is also printed in this edition of the Bethel News. Truck loading activities will begin around **3 pm**, and the Annual Meeting itself starts at **5 pm** that Sunday afternoon.

Church The Annual Report (ACR) packet has been mailed to all of our member churches, and I want to encourage all of our Church Clerks to complete the information required and either return it to the Associational Office or submit it online by the deadline of Tuesday, October 3rd. This will enable us to complete the information for our Book of Reports for the Fall Meeting. Enthusiasm is building for our firstever **Backpacks of Hope**+ distribution in SW Georgia this December. Kenny & Melanie Williams, our Associational Coordinators, have done a great iob of organizing this and of building a team of volunteers from all six of our counties to carry out this huge task. Meanwhile, we are beginning to hear from other associations and churches throughout Georgia who wish to partner with us in this effort by sending backpacks and volunteers to help with the events. For information about the distribution event and contact person(s) in your area, please see the list in this edition of the Bethel News. If you or a group from your church wish to help on distribution day in your county, just give your coordinator (s) a call.

Finally, I want to make you all aware of the critical financial needs at Rehoboth Ranch Ministries. Rehoboth Ranch is a Christ-centered transformation program for men struggling with chemical addictions, and it is located right here in Calhoun I have the honor of County. serving on the Board of Directors for Rehoboth Ranch, and have seen first hand the mighty works of God in the lives of these men. Since they began housing clients last Fall, a dozen men have already been served by the ministry, and there are currently seven residents at the Ranch. One man has already completed the program and % praduated % Most importantly, two men have begun new lives in Christ since the ministry began.

Many of you are aware that the Bethel Association secured a generous grant from a foundation this year for the purpose of paying the cost of remodeling the old golf-course clubhouse building into a residential %anch-house+ home for 12 men. That project is now nearing completion, and it appears we will have enough funds from the grant to complete this initial phase.

Meanwhile however, there are regular expenses incurred by the ministry such as insurance, electricity, and food which are not covered by the grant. Rehoboth Ranch Ministries (a 501c-3 Non-profit corporation) depends on donations from individuals and churches to provide for most of these ongoing operating expenses. The ministry now stands in critical need of more ministry partners to provide regular, monthly financial support. I want to encourage you to go out to Rehoboth Ranch and see for yourself what God is doing out there. Visitors are always welcome at Rehoboth Ranch! Or call Director Rob Morgan (229-733-9152) and request a speaker to come and share the Rehoboth story with your church or group.

This is a worthwhile and muchneeded local mission opportunity for you and your church to invest in. You will be glad you did!






Ryan Lancaster to Arlington Baptist Church as their new student Minister (F-T).
